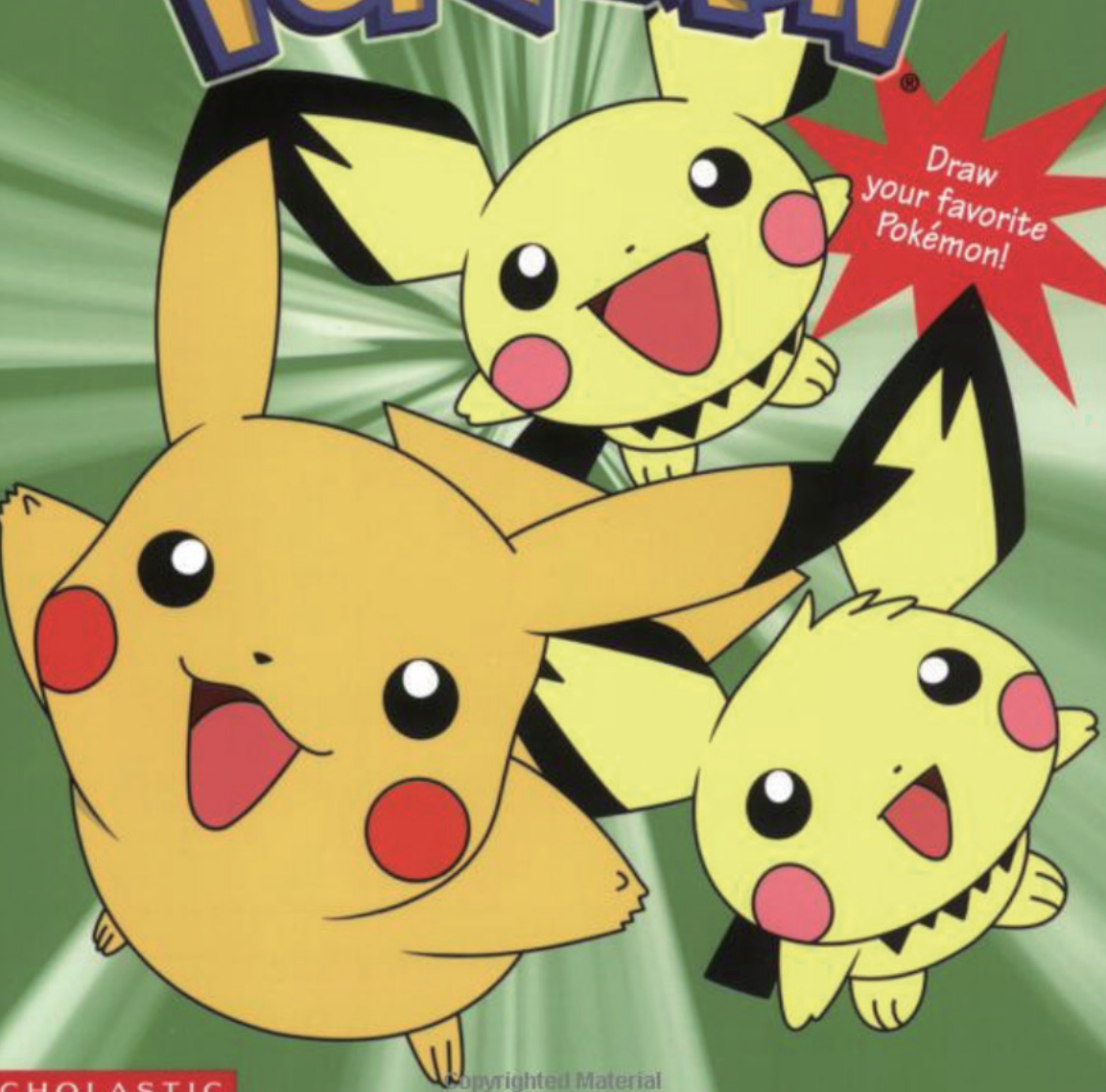

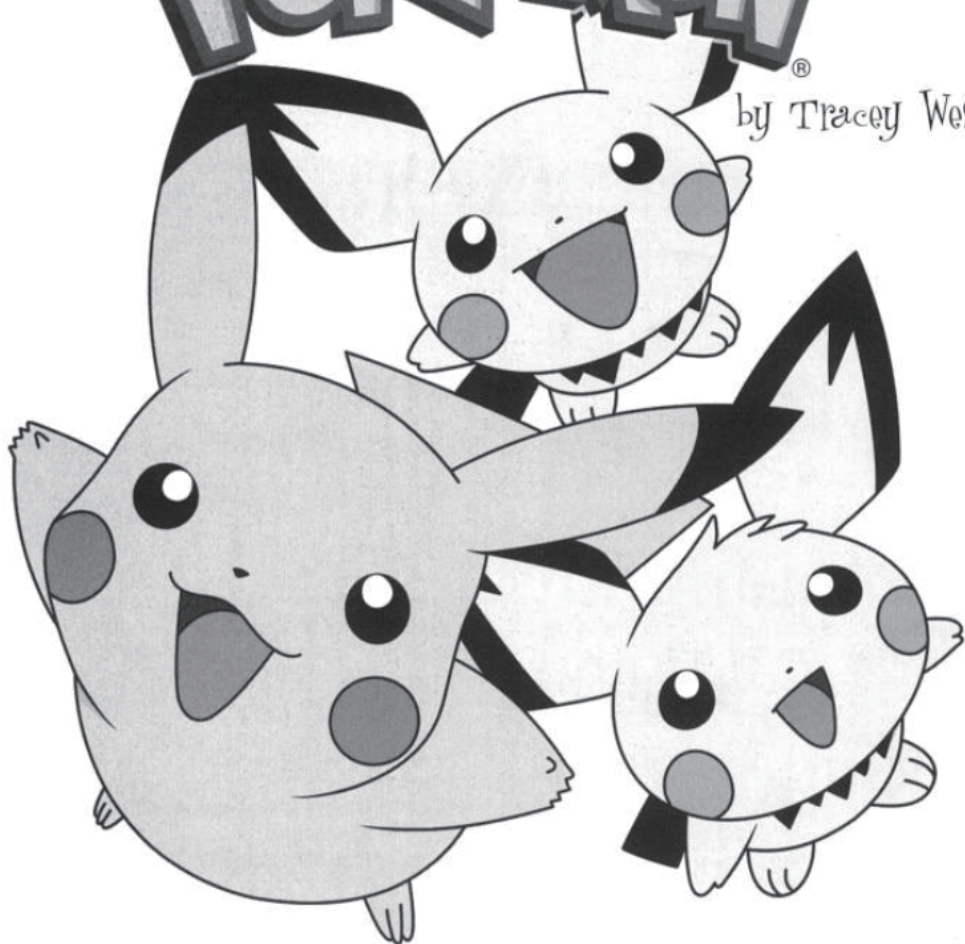

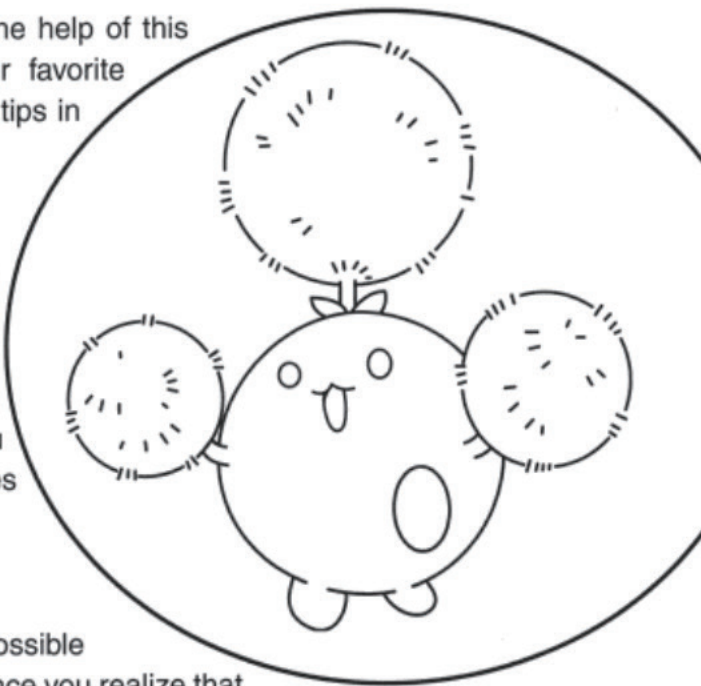

GOTTA DRAW 'EM ALL!

Drawing Pokémon is fun! With the help of this book, you'll learn to draw your favorite Pokémon like a pro. Keep these tips in mind while you work:

***USE A PENCIL!**

As you draw, you'll be adding different parts of your Pokémon on top of each other, and you'll have to erase lines you don't need. When you are done, you can go over the important lines with a black marker.



***KNOW YOUR SHAPES!**

Many Pokémon might seem impossible to draw, but they're not so hard once you realize that they are often made up of simple shapes such as circles, ovals, and triangles. Check out this Jumpluff, for example. If you can draw circles, you can definitely draw Jumpluff!

***GO AHEAD, COLOR THEM!**

Keep an official Pokémon handbook nearby when you're coloring in your drawings. That way you'll get the colors just perfect.

Ready to dive in?

Get your pencil, get some paper, and get drawing!

IGGLYBUFF™

Height: 1' 00"
Weight: 2 lb

It's easy to see why Iggybuff is called the Balloon Pokémon. Besides being round, Iggybuff's body is very flexible and elastic.

Start with a simple circle. Add two small circles for the eyes, then four curved lines for Iggybuff's tiny hands and feet.

Start adding detail to Iggybuff's eyes. Add its mouth next, and keep it smaller than the eyes. Don't forget to add the poofy shape to the top of Iggybuff's head!

No Iggybuff would be complete without the spiral-shaped curl above its eyes.

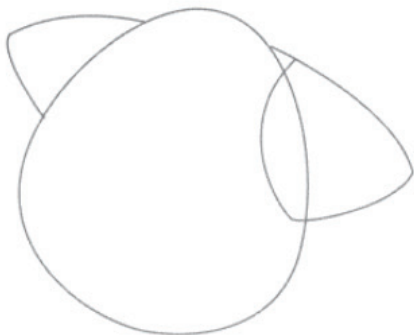


Now that you've drawn Iggybuff, see if you can draw its evolved form, Jigglypuff! You'll start with the same simple circle.

Cleffa's pointy ears and feet give its body a star shape. That's why some people think that Cleffa, like Clefairy and Clefable, traveled to Earth on a meteor.

Take away the pointy ears and feet, and Cleffa's body is shaped a lot like an egg. Start by drawing the egg shape, then add two rounded triangles at the top for ears.

Cleffa's eyes and cheeks are thin ovals. Add a wavy line for its mouth, and two rounded triangles for hands and a curved line for the tail. Finally, add the feet and the cute curl on top of its head.

Fill in part of Cleffa's eyes with black, leaving some white on the top. When you're done, make sure you erase any lines you don't need.

To make a smiling mouth, draw a straight line and a curved line.

The leaf growing on top of Chikorita's head gives off a sweet smell, but it can be used in the devastating Razor Leaf Attack.

First, draw the outline of Chikorita's body. Then go to the top of the head and draw the leaf. Start with a long, curved line, then add the wavy line underneath.

Add a curved line to make Chikorita's front leg, and give Chikorita a rounded triangle for a tail. Finally, add the buttonlike dots that ring Chikorita's neck. They are shaped like gumdrops.

Use straight lines to draw Chikorita's eyes. The slants on top of the eyes show that Chikorita is in attack mode.

4



Add detail to the inside of Chikorita's eyes. Erase any outline lines you don't need anymore. Now Chikorita is ready for action!

CYNDACQUIL™

Height: 1' 08"
Weight: 17 lb



Those flames shooting out of Cyndaquil's back aren't always there. This Fire Pokémon shoots them when it gets scared or needs to attack. When it's resting, it curls up into a ball.

1



Begin by drawing a perfect circle for Cyndaquil's head. Add a rounded triangle for Cyndaquil's snout. Draw an oval for Cyndaquil's left leg, and add the lines for its body. Then draw the rest of the legs, arms, feet, and the outline of the flames shooting out of its back.

2



Erase the line attaching the head to the snout. Then, add a large curved line for Cyndaquil's eye.

3



Draw more jagged, straight lines inside the flames. Smooth and perfect the shape of Cyndaquil's head, arms, and legs.

4



Erase any extra outline lines. Then stand back! Cyndaquil is one hot Pokémon.



Totodile looks tough in this pose, but you'll usually find Ash's Totodile laughing, showing off, and having fun.

1



Draw one part of Totodile at a time, following the shapes as best as you can. Start with the head. Add its body and tail. Give Totodile two strong legs and two short arms. Then add the triangle-shaped spikes to Totodile's back and tail.

Add some straight lines to Totodile's chest. Then draw the line of Totodile's long, crooked jaw.

Use this step to make the outline of Totodile's body rounder and smoother. Then finish this step with an outline for a big eye.
