



"When they start to get bubbly it means they're ready to flip!" his friend said. George flipped each pancake as it was ready—one, two, three!






George started pouring a lot of syrup on his pancakes.




George put on his coat and went outside. There were many trees on the Renkinses' farm. He tapped on each tree like he was knocking on a door.


