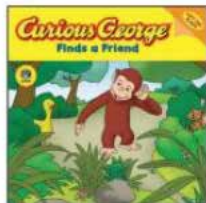
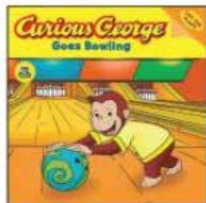
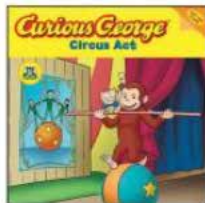
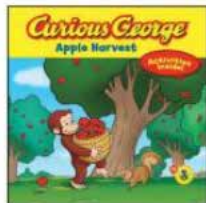
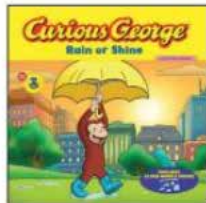
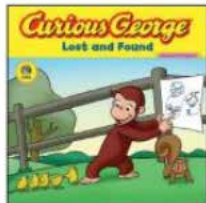
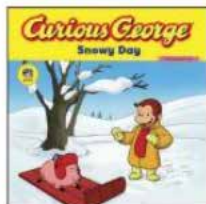
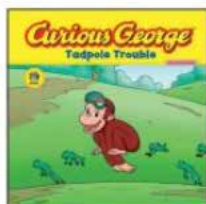
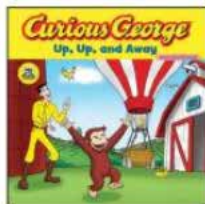
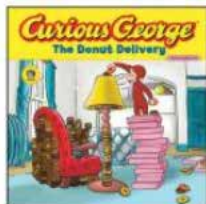


George had poured all of the syrup on his pancakes. Now there was no syrup left for his friend. But George had an idea. There were plenty of trees outside. All he had to do was tap them!
