

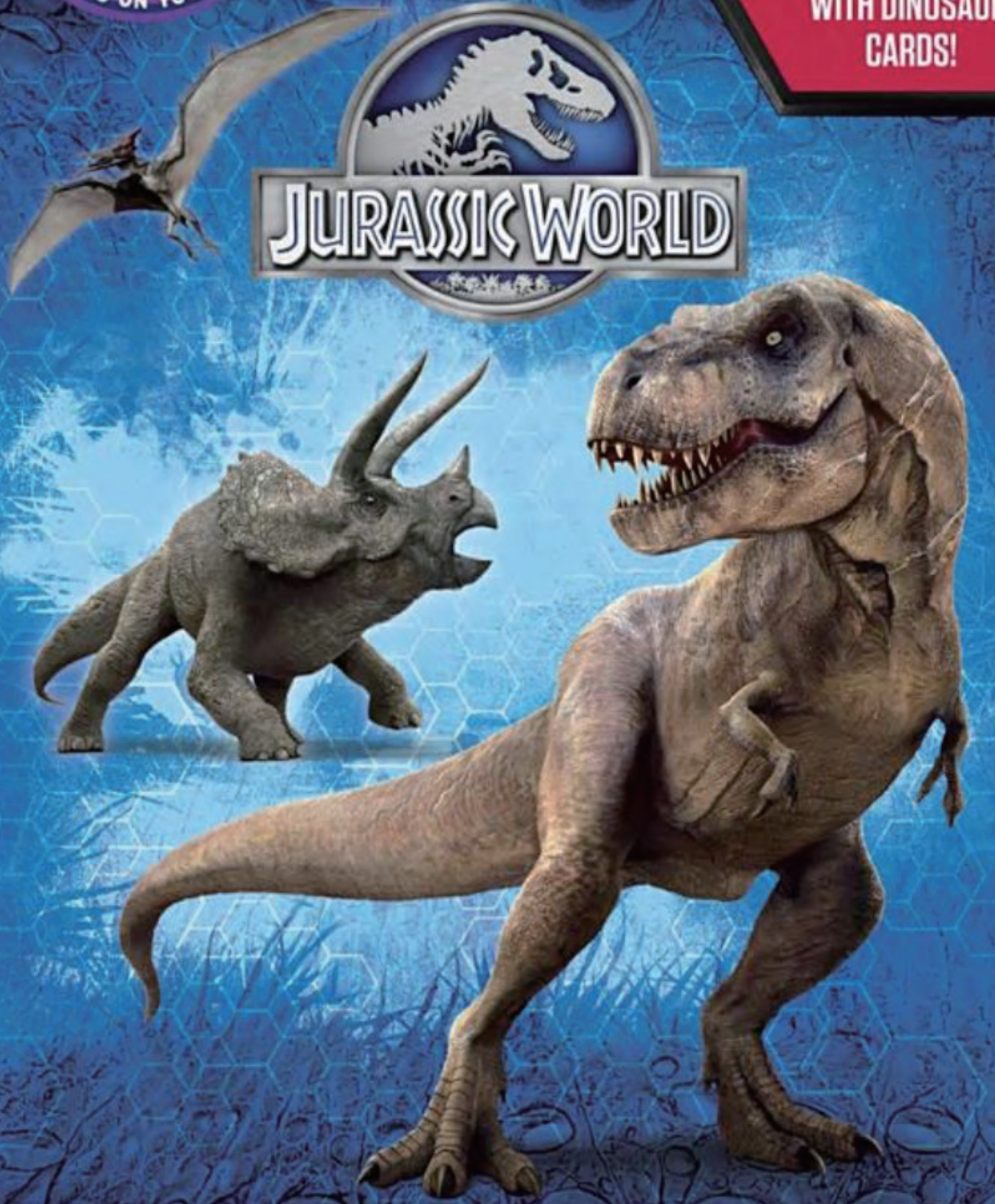

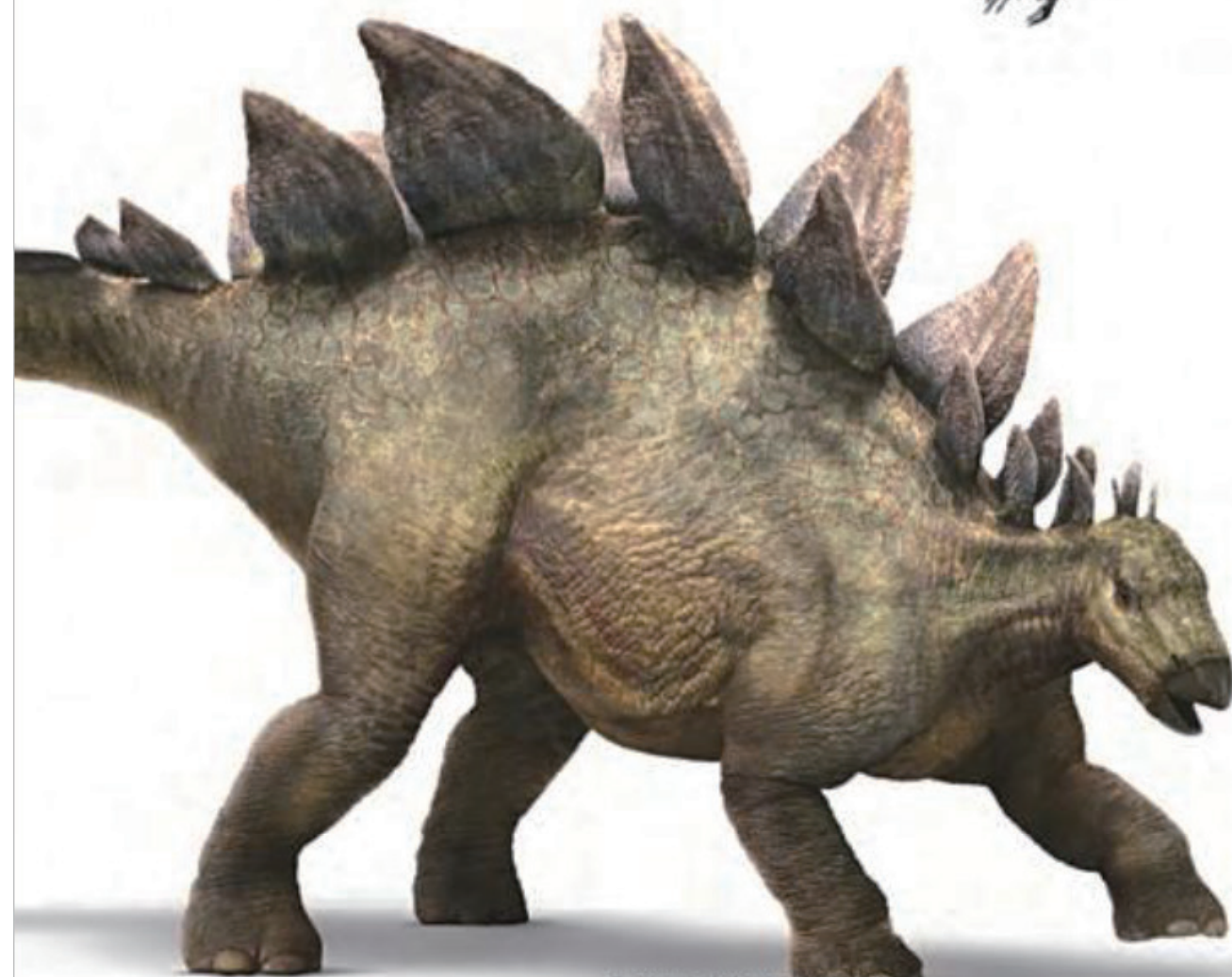

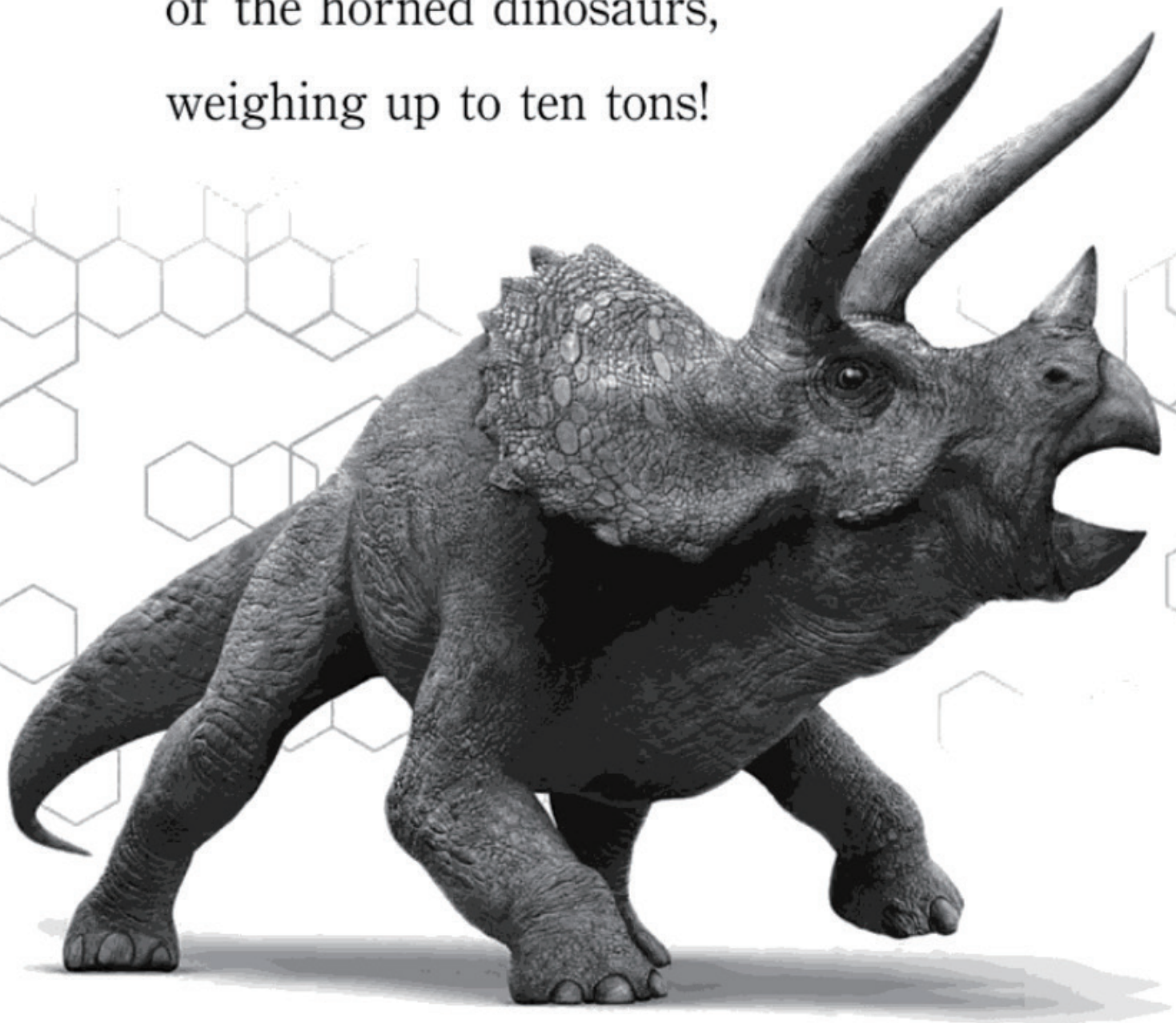


Triceratops
