

Help your child to read!

This book practises these letters and letter sounds. Point and say the sounds with your child:



Your child may need help to read these common tricky words:



Before reading

- Look at the cover picture and read the title together. Read the back cover blurb to your child.
- Ask your child: Have you built a den or fort in your house? What did you use?

During reading

- If your child gets stuck on a word, remind them to sound it out and then blend the sounds to read the word: p-er-ch, perch.
- · If they are still stuck, show them how to read the word.
- Enjoy looking at the pictures together. Pause to talk about the story.


After reading
