

Before reading

- Look at the cover picture and read the title together.
 Read the back cover blurb to your child.
- Ask your child: What is sightseeing? Would you like to go sightseeing? What might you see?
- Talk about the image in the magnifying glass.

During reading


- If your child gets stuck on a word, remind them to sound it out and then blend the sounds to read the word: t-ow-er, tower.
- If they are still stuck, show them how to read the word.
- Enjoy looking at the pictures together. Pause to talk about the information.

After reading

- Talk about the images on page 16. What can your child tell you about them?
- Ask your child: What did you see in the book?
- Discuss with your child how they would like to go sightseeing in York, England
 by boat or on foot? Ask them to explain why they made this choice.
