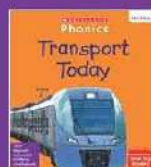

Help your child to read!

This book practises words with more than one consonant next to each other, plus long vowel sounds (like **pr**oof or **fl**ower).

Before reading

- Look at the cover picture and read the title together. Read the back cover blurb to your child.
- Ask your child: *Do you have a pet? If you could have any pet, what would you choose?*
- Talk about the image in the magnifying glass.

During reading

- If your child gets stuck on a word, remind them to sound it out and then blend the sounds to read the word: b-r-igh-t, bright.
- If they are still stuck, show them how to read the word.
- Enjoy looking at the pictures together. Pause to talk about the information.

After reading

- Talk about the images on page 16. What can your child tell you about them?
- Ask your child: *What do pet rabbits need?*
- Talk with your child about their favourite picture in the book. Ask them to explain why they like it.





Rabbits love rabbits!
They like to be in a crowd.

Rabbits need food pellets and fresh greens. They can munch herbs and thorns. Avoid too much sweet food, like carrots.





They like flowers too, but some are toxic. Check the garden!

If you must scoop up a rabbit,
support its back legs.
