After a few festive musical performances, the mayor announced it was time to light the tree. The crowd cheered and counted down: "Five, four, three, two, one . . ."

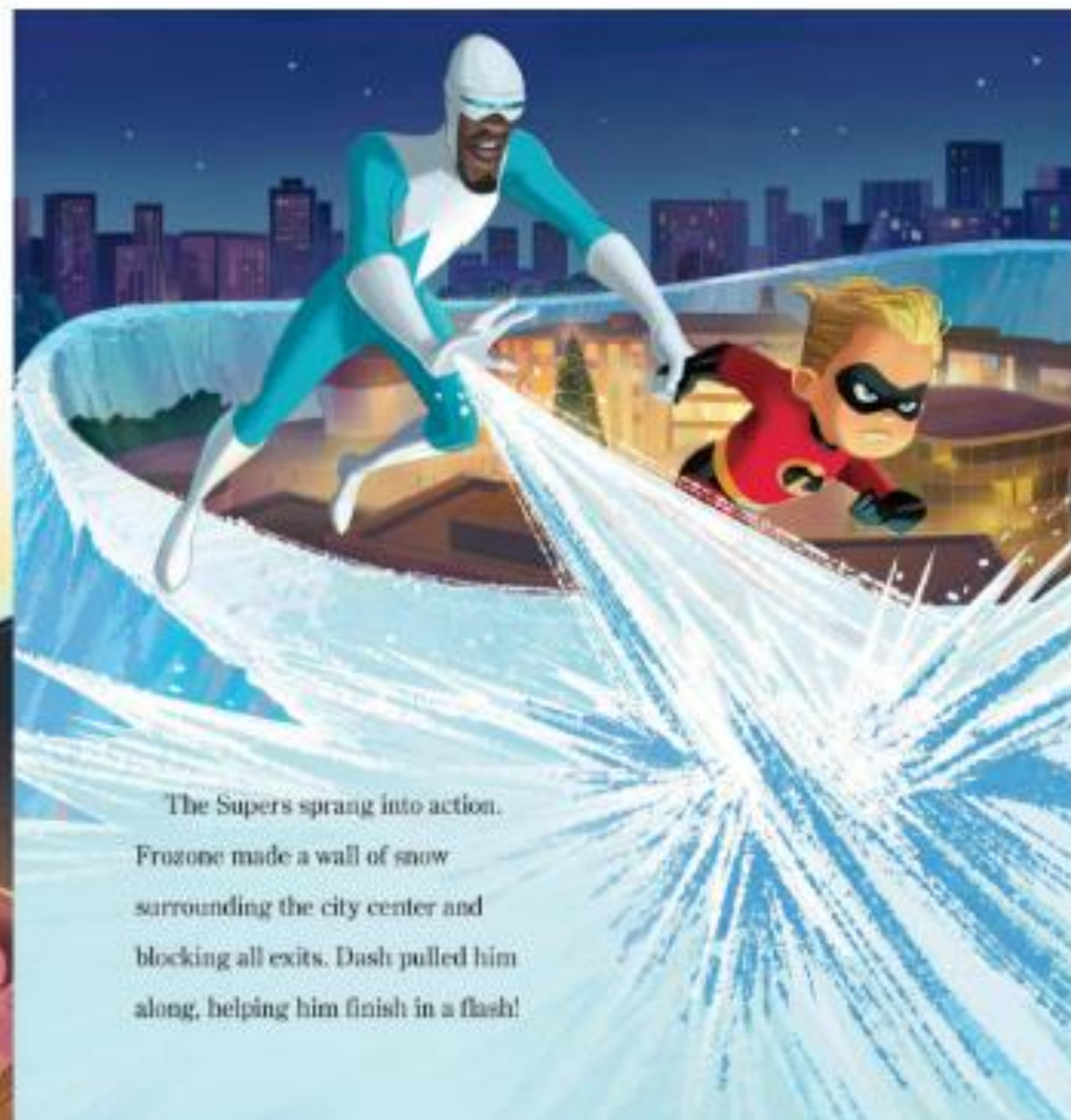
The Incredibles pulled the lever!

happened!



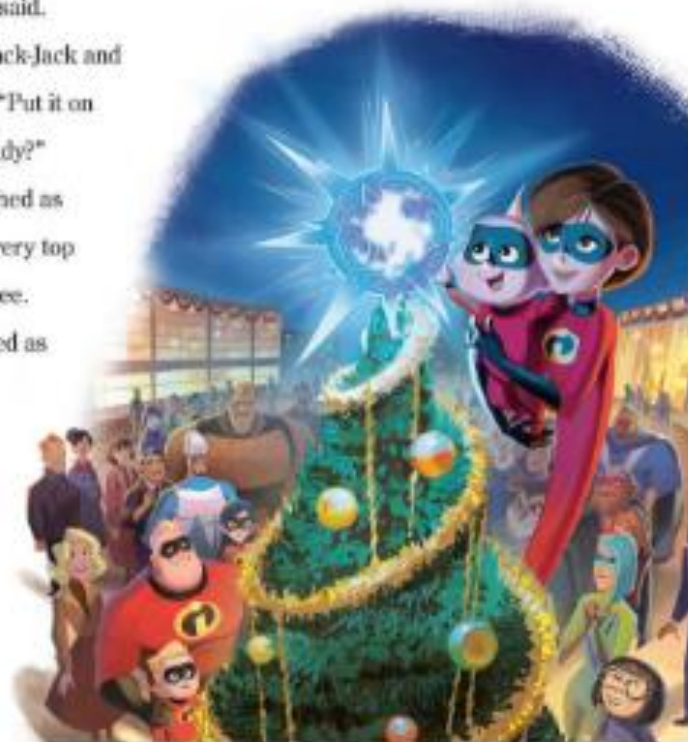
"Auntie Edna's so proud of you, darling," Edna cooed as she handed
Jack-Jack the tree topper.

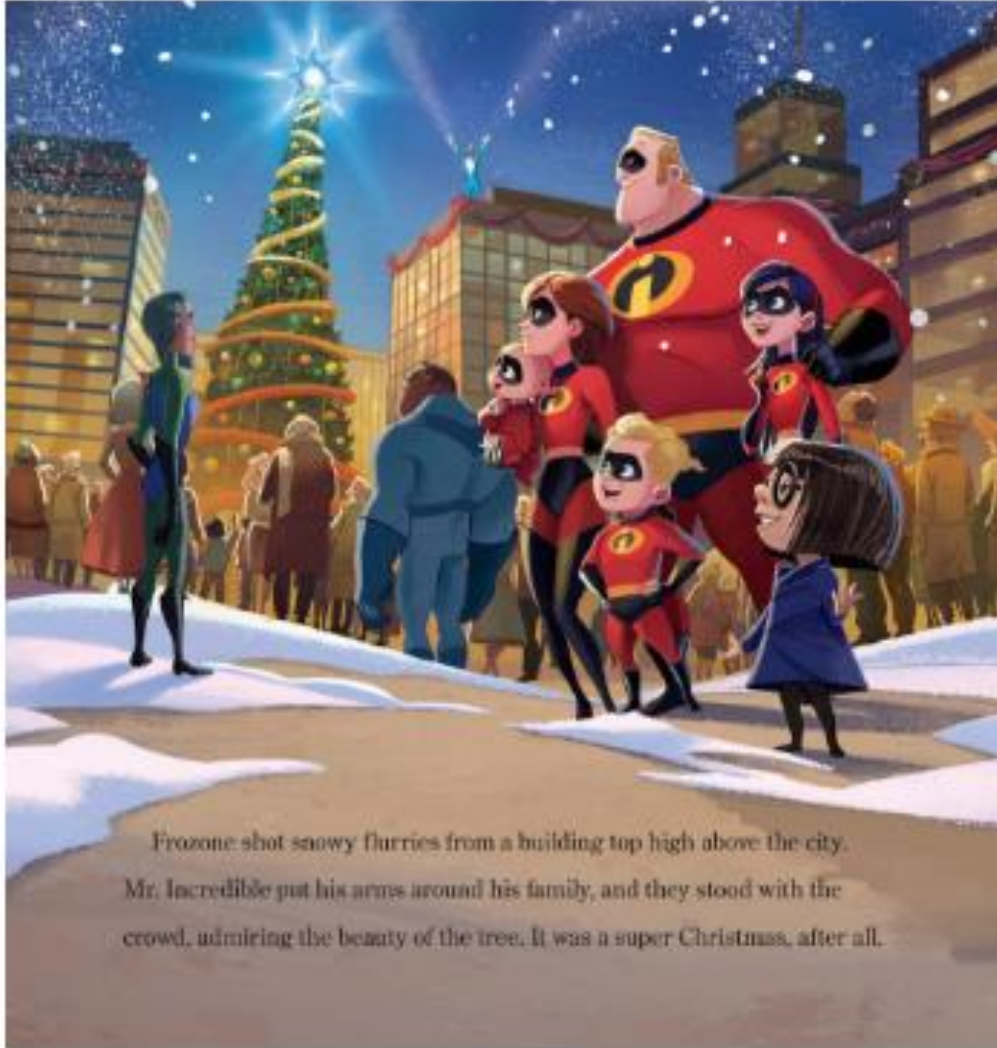
The baby Super smiled, admiring the tree topper's sparkle and shine.
