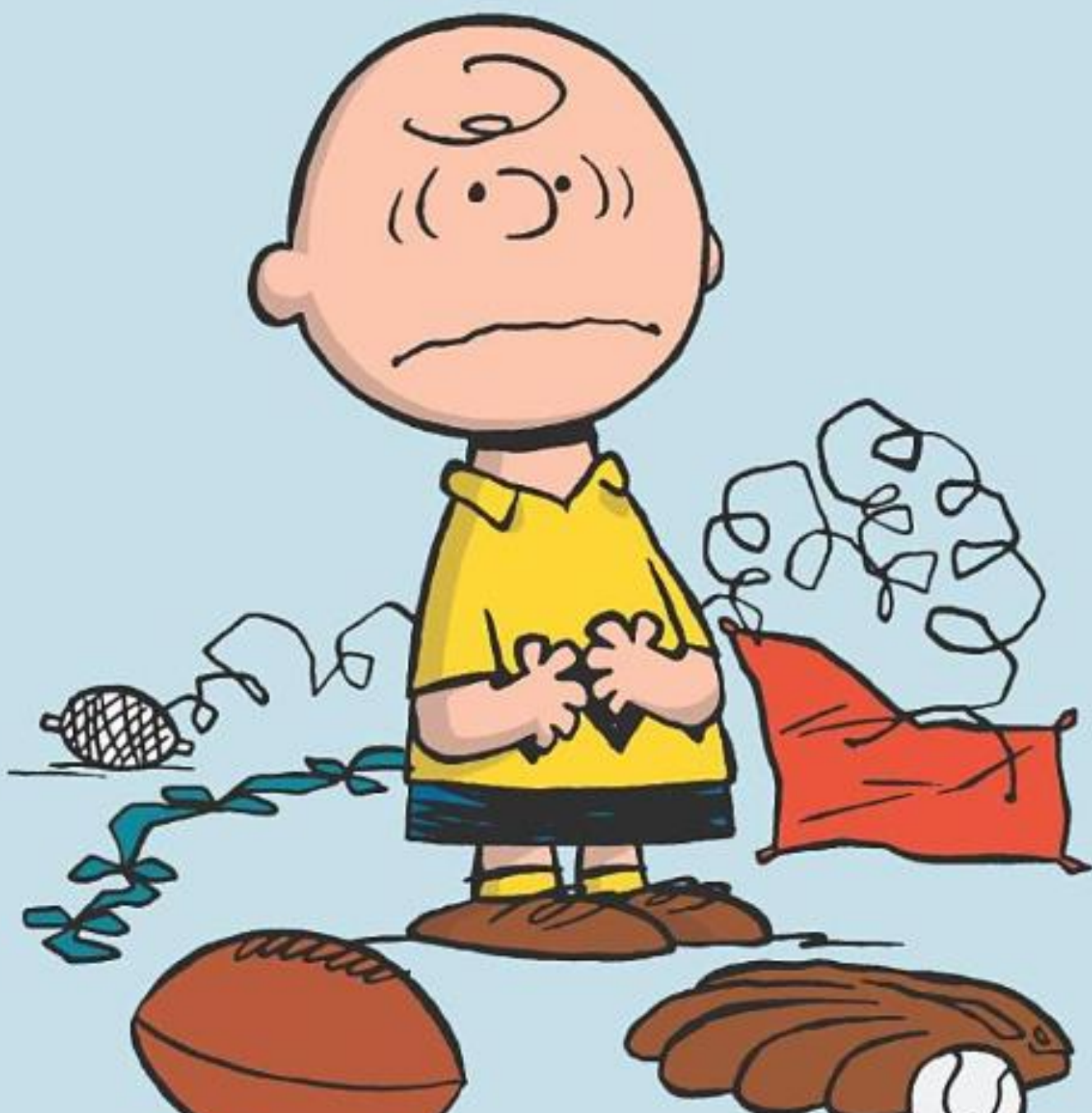

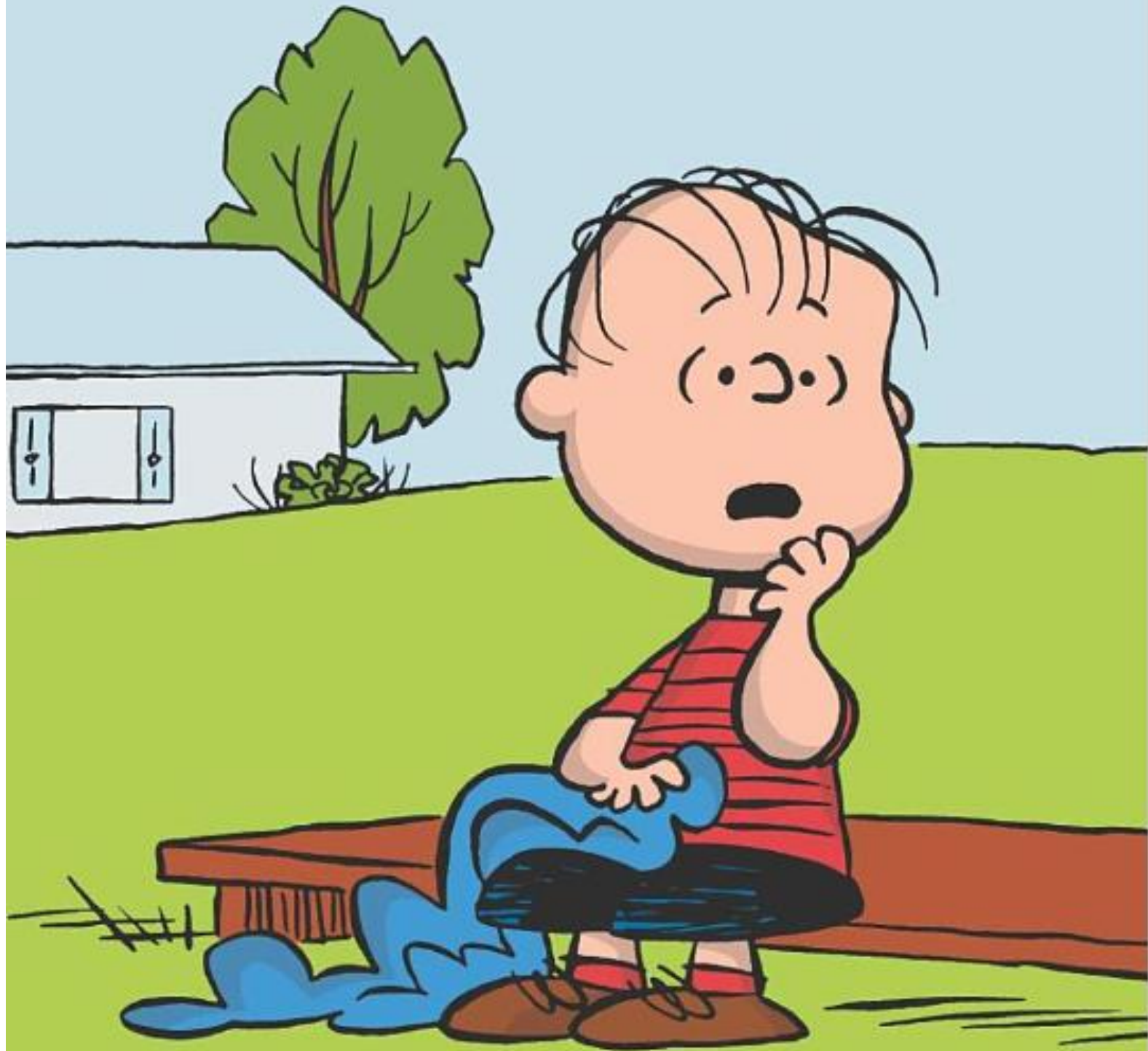

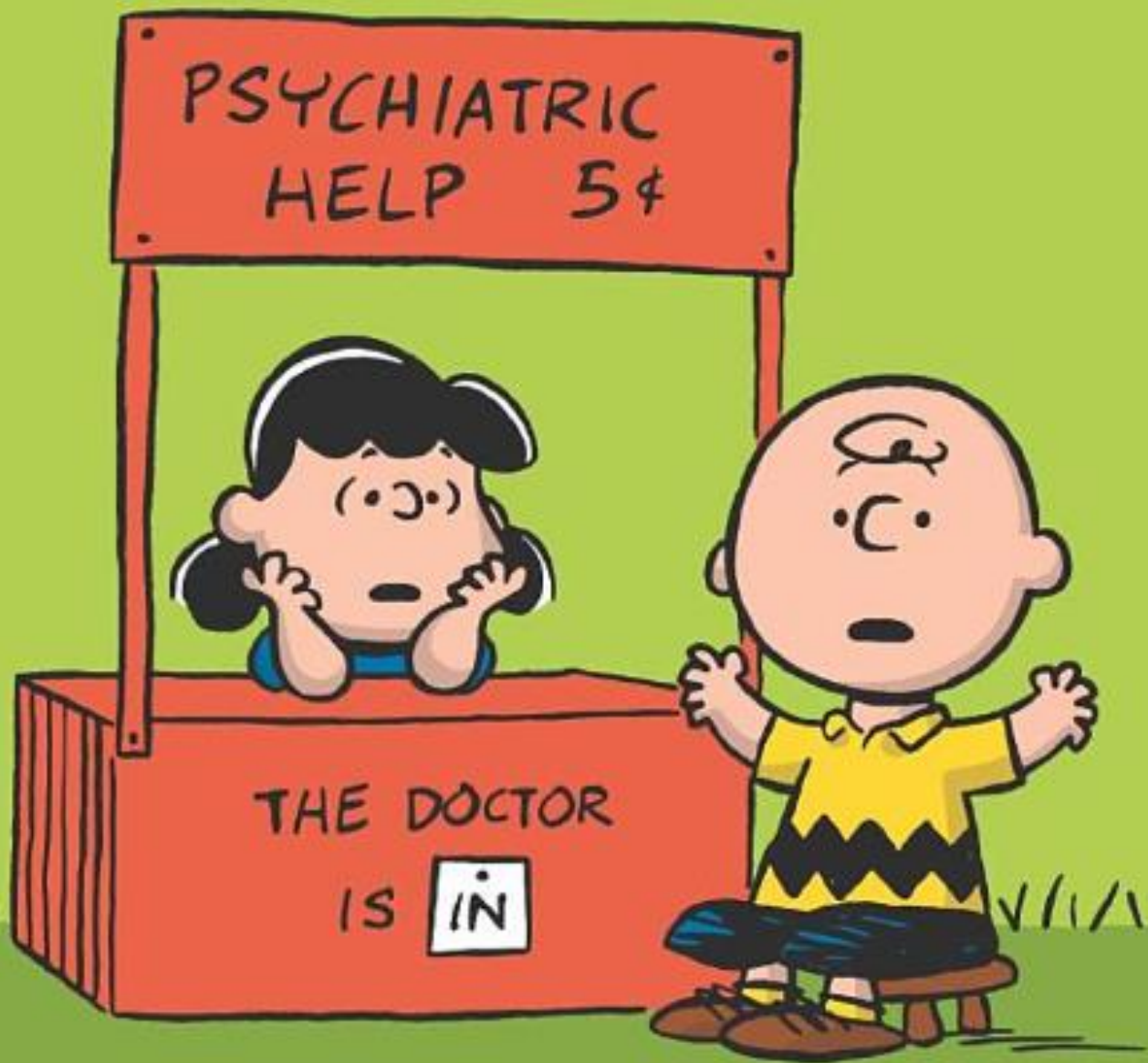
“You look down, Charlie Brown,”
