






Eating kangaroo only became more common in the last twenty years.




Kangaroo Steak

Today they are made with flour, oats, golden syrup, sugar, butter, and dried coconut. But in the past they did not have oats in them.




Why did people start to make Anzac biscuits?

Not a lot of food was available during the war. The biscuits were made from ingredients that could be easily found at home. Eggs were not easily available at this time. So, golden syrup was used instead. This helped keep all the ingredients together.









These famous biscuits get their name from the Australian and New Zealand Army Corps (ANZAC).



Anzac Biscuits

What did women do with Anzac biscuits during World War I?

Golden syrup also made the biscuits strong enough to send overseas. The women at home sent the soldiers packages with Anzac biscuits in them.





What is Anzac Day?

Anzac Day on April 25th honors the people who were in the wars. Most people make or buy Anzac biscuits around Anzac Day.





Lamingtons

What are lamingtons?

Lamingtons are made from squares of butter cake or soft cake. The square of cake is coated in a layer of chocolate sauce. It is then rolled in dried coconut.







Why might some people think the lamington is from New Zealand?

This is because of a story in a newspaper. The story was printed on April 1st, 2014. The story said this popular cake was really from New Zealand. The story said the cake was known as a Wellington. But this story was a joke!

What is a story about the origin of lamingtons?

One story says that Lord Lamington's chef first made this famous cake. The chef had to feed some guests. He only had a few ingredients to use. So, he cut up some cake. He dipped the pieces of cake in chocolate sauce. He then put dried coconut on top of them.


